The main aims of the training

- To discuss about how to support our trainers and youth leaders for teenager's projects in the context of the Youth in Action programme.
- To create a place to exchange methods and experiences among organisations
- To discuss about the needs, expectations and special methods for teenagers projects.
- To share tools to find local partners to organise teen projects as well to promote teen projects in their countries.
- To learn how a teenage project has to be organised from the very first beginning till the evaluation phase and to have a well trained leaders team for a TEEN project.
- To improve the parents approach involvement on the projects (they are as well target group when it comes to work with teenagers) that we are working on a high quality level.
- To engage participants to take part in projects in order to reach, include, integrate and help to develop resources to work with the target group we chose, TEENAGERS.
- To get new inputs and explore the opportunities of Erasmus + in the creation of future common projects.

During this intensive week the trainers team tried to support the learning process of the participants in the fields of the youth active citizenship, specially focusing in the European Citizenship.

The methods of the training were mainly based in non-formal learning methodologies, always active and trying to experience first, in order to create and discover together as a group our learning outcomes in the debriefing of each activity.

The activities developed were games, reflection groups, big and little groups discussions, workshops, projects simulations, real cases discussions, open space for future projects, YiA and Erasmus + resources presentations, and there was a space for the selfreflection of the learning process of the participants.

In this training course the 22 participants came from Austria, Hungary, France, Greece, Czech Republic, Spain, Italy, Estonia, Romania and Latvia.

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
